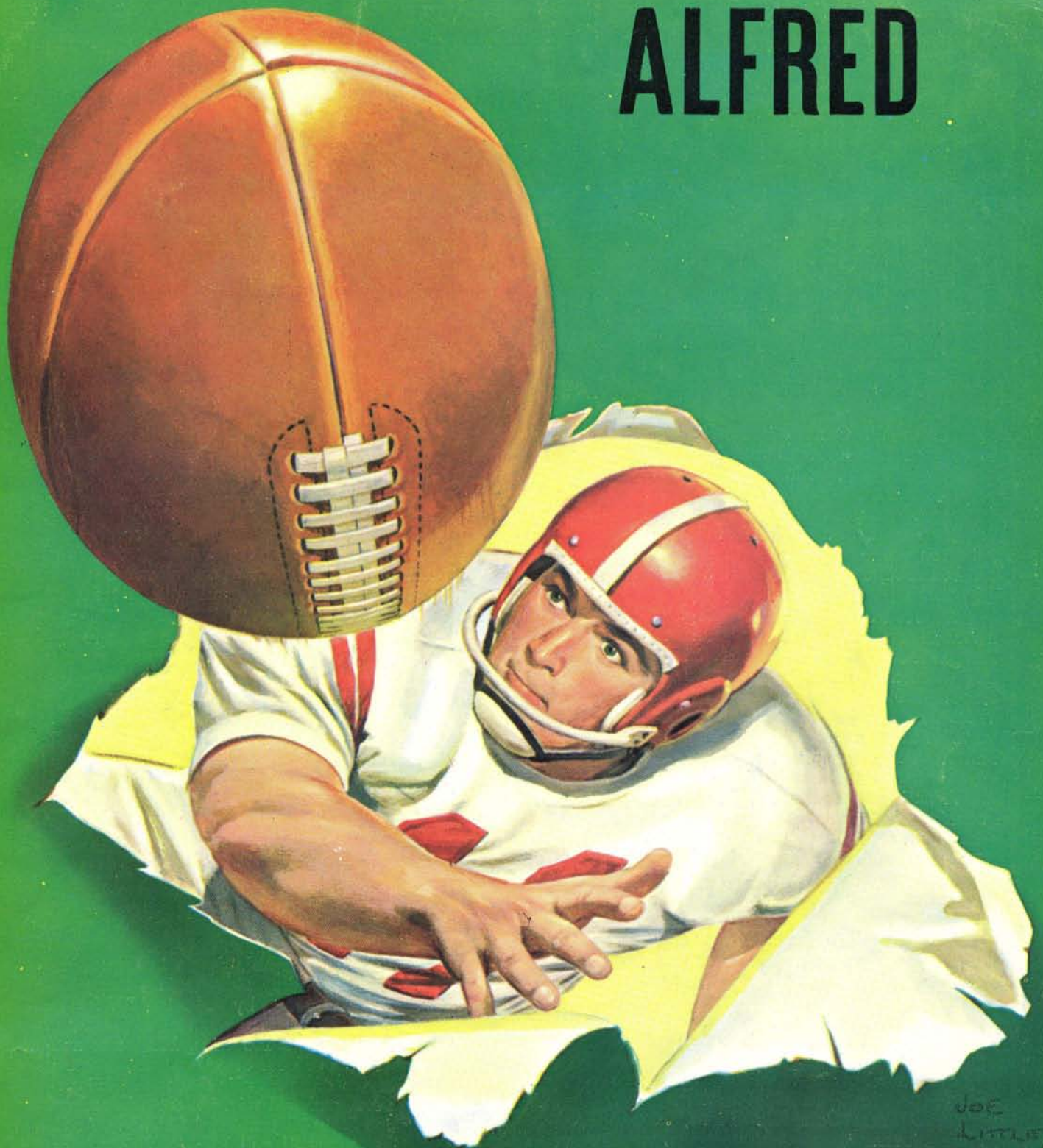

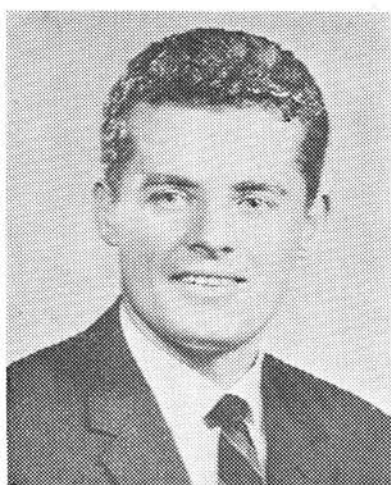

Meet the Visiting Coach



James W. Garrett is Athletic Director and Head Coach of football and baseball at Susquehanna University, Selinsgrove, Pa. Appointed in July, of 1960, the former Utah State and professional grid star has coached Susquehanna football teams to an over-all record of 32-2-1 in his first four seasons, compiling records of 7-1 in 1960, 8-0-1 in 1961, 9-0-0 in 1962 and 8-1-0 in 1963.

At Utah State University, Logan, Garrett was a standout performer in 1950 and 1951, earning recognition as All-Skyline Conference fullback and honorable mention on All-West and All-American teams. He also was twice named Player of the Week in the Skyline Conference. In addition, the versatile athlete was a catcher on the varsity baseball team for two years.

A native of Rutherford, New Jersey, Susquehanna's head mentor began his sports career at Rutherford (N.J.) High School where he won seven letters in football, basketball and baseball, and was four times elected to All-State teams—twice in football and twice in baseball.

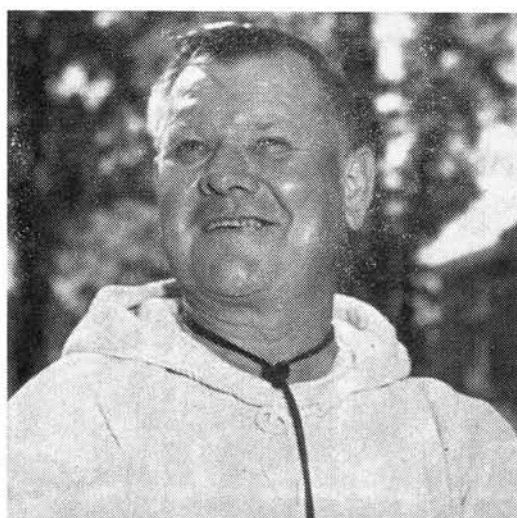
Following his graduation from Utah State, Garrett spent two years in the U.S. Army at Fort Lee, Virginia, where, as a first lieutenant, he was athletic director of the Quartermaster School. He was the regular fullback on the post football team. In 1952 and 1953 he was All-Army fullback.

He played professional football for one season each with the Philadelphia Eagles, New York Giants, British Columbia Lions, and Ottawa Rough Riders.

Prior to joining the staff at Susquehanna, Garrett was backfield coach at Lehigh University and had previously coached at Pawling (N.Y.) High School and the U.S. Coast Guard Academy. He holds the B.S. degree from Utah State and the M.A. from Columbia University.

Garrett and his wife, the former Jane Frances Lentz, are the parents of five young children.

Saxon Coach in 24th Year



One of a dozen veterans of college coaching in the nation, Alex Yunevich has piloted teams of Saxon Warriors at Alfred University to 104 victories in 23 seasons. He opened at Alfred with an undefeated season in 1937 and his teams have repeated that feat during four other years. The 1956 team was cited by the Touchdown Club of Washington, D.C., as the "small college team of the year" on basis of its perfect record.

There is a four-year gap in Alfred's gridiron history because of the fact that the University declared a moratorium on football while Alex was in the Navy during World War II.

Alex had three years of coaching at Central Michigan before coming to Alfred. During the total of 26 years, his teams posted 114 wins, 67 losses and 10 ties.

Three other college coaches with the same number of years in the business are: Bernie Heseltin of Lawrence College (Wisconsin)—109-73-5; Paul Hinkle of Butler University (Indiana)—144-67-12; and William Nicks of Prairie View (Texas)—175-56-19.

The dean of the durable dozen in the nation is Fred T. Long of Wiley College in Texas with 42 years of service marked by 224 wins, 137 losses and 31 ties. Dr. Eddie Anderson of Holy Cross is second with 38 years, 196 wins, 123 losses and 15 ties. Jess Neely of Rice 37 years and 199 wins; J. M. Christiansen of Concordia College in Minnesota has 35 years and 162 wins; Warren Woodson of New Mexico State 33 years and 211 wins; A. C. Moore of Chattanooga 31 and 147; D. V. Beede of Youngstown University 31 and 143; and Daniel Jessee of Trinity (Connecticut)—29 and 139.

Alex Yunevich is a native of Bicknell, Indiana, where he won 16 letters in high school. He was a fullback at Purdue for three years. During that time he was chosen to the All Big-Ten three times and was a third choice All America. He was also captain of the track team during off-season for football.

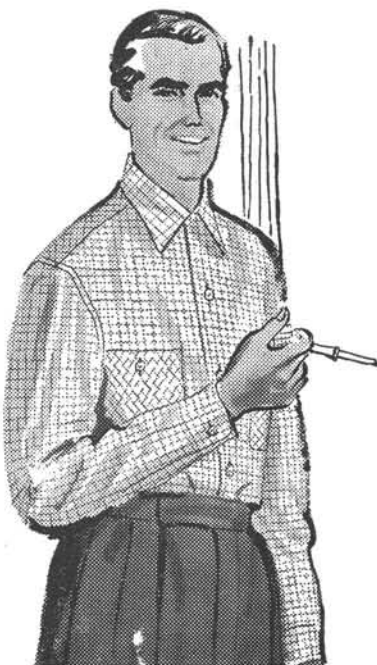

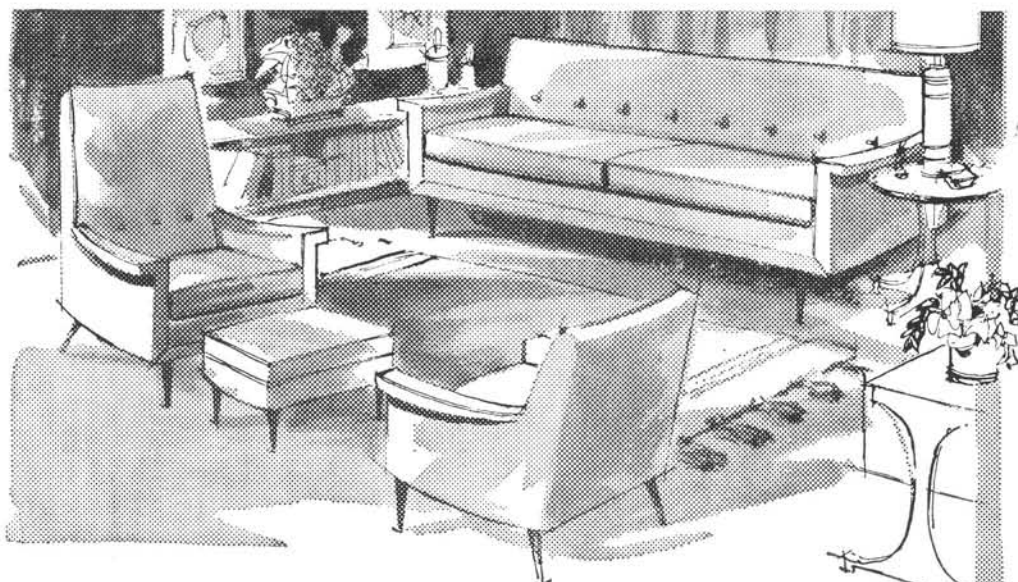

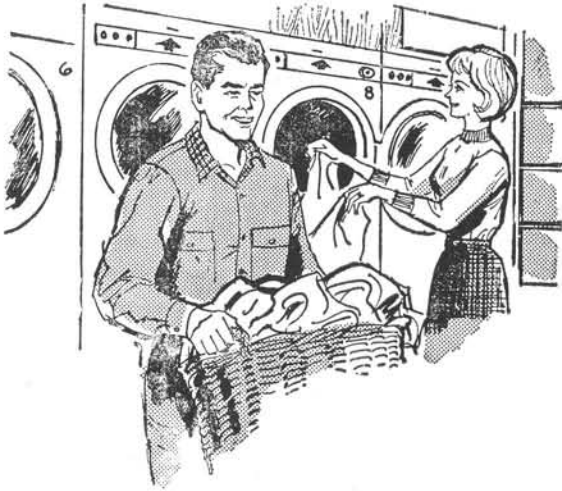
