Student Worker Payroll Documents

Are you a brand new student worker to campus who has never completed new hire paperwork with Human Resources in Greene Hall?

If so, you need to know that before you can begin work you need to stop down to Greene Hall between the hours of 8:30-4:30 M-F to complete your new hire paperwork with us.

To complete your I-9, which says you have the right to work in the US, you must provide acceptable I-9 documents from the list attached. It should be noted that these documents must be unexpired and original (no copies are accepted).

Documents to bring to your meeting with HR:

- -Make sure you have forms of identification
- -Bank account and routing number if you wish to have direct deposit
- -Wage statement filled out from your Supervisor and with your signature on it
- -If this will be a Work Study position, bring your EAC Card from Financial Aid that is filled out from your Supervisor

If you are an international student, additional documents will be required:

- -Passport
- -Visa
- -Social Security Card or Letter of Application
- I-94
- -I-20

HR Tip of the Month

Did you know that as an employee of Alfred University you may qualify for Public Service Loan Forgiveness?

Qualifying Factors:

- -Must work at least 30 hours a week
- -Your federal loans have to be Direct Loans to qualify
- -Your loans must be paid under an income based repayment plan
- -Have to make 120 on-time qualifying payments then the rest of your loans are forgiven
- -Complete and submit the Employment Certification for Public Service Loan Forgiveness form yearly to your loan servicer to certify your employment
- -Human Resources can certify your employment and verify employment dates
