What is a Responsible Employee/Campus Security Authority and am I one?

All full-time staff and faculty of Alfred University are required to promptly report information they have about possible sexual harassment or sexual misconduct, including but not limited to sexual assault, domestic or dating violence, and stalking to the designated Title IX Coordinator or Title IX Deputy Coordinator. Many others are required to report possible crimes to Public Safety.

This session will help fulfill the annual training requirement for employees who are designated as Responsible Employees and/or Campus Security Authorities. This session is geared toward any employee who wishes to learn more about the responsibilities under Alfred University's Discrimination, Harassment and Sexual Misconduct Policy and The Clery Act.

Volunteers to Serve at Title IX Investigators Needed

Mark Guinan, Director of Human Resources, is looking for faculty/staff volunteers to serve as Title IX Investigators and Board Members. There will be training provided to teach you how to do a proper investigation.

Responsibilities:

- *Receive complaints of sexual misconduct, sexual harassment, gender-related violence including stalking and intimate partner violence, and protected class discrimination and harassment and related retaliation
- *Identify University policies and/or Student Conduct Code provisions relevant to a complaint
- *Exercise judgment regarding the resolution of complaints including informal resolution and formal investigation
- *Conduct a prompt, equitable and impartial administrative investigation into complaints including identifying and interviewing parties and identifying, gathering and assessing information relevant to the investigation; apply relevant policies and make findings of fact in individual cases
- *Actively foster and maintain a climate that is supportive of students and respectful of difference

HR Tip of the Week

Did you know that you can manage your retirement funds with TIAA online?

Once you've logged in with your user name and password, select My Account. From there, you can: *Change the investment of future contributions by selecting Change Investments, then Change Allocation of Future Contributions. Choose each account or contract you would like to update, then enter your investment instructions.

- *Transfer assets among the plan's investment options by selecting Change Investments, then Change My Investments. Choose each account or contract you would like to update, then enter your investment instructions.
- *Update your beneficiary designation by selecting Add/edit beneficiaries, then identify the account you wish to update and select Edit Account Designations.
- *Review and update your personal information.
- *Check account balances and confirm contributions.
- *View and research the performance of the plan's investment options.
