Accord Services of Allegany County offers a domestic abuse shelter for abused women; they also provide services to help women get past these traumatic experiences and on to living a fulfilled and productive life at no cost.

In collaboration with Alfred University and the Women's Leadership Academy, a series of events called "When push comes to Shove" will take place to educate the community more about domestic violence and relational abuse. What are the water resource risks associated with Marcellus Shale gas development? How can these risks be planned for, prevented, detected, and mitigated. Brian Rahm and his colleagues at the NYS Water Resources Institute have been developing a framework for identifying and conceptualizing water resource risks along with approaches for managing impacts. They are also exploring the role of monitor systems in detecting and preventing water resource impacts, and what such systems can and cannot do. Learn about this aspect of the Marcellus Shale gas development.
