Alfred University student Nick Labate is coordinating a community-wide initiative to produce ceramic bowls and share homemade soup to help support local hunger initiatives. The culmination of his efforts will be a community lunch on Friday, Feb. 13, 2015 as attendees buy or bid on quality bowls filled with delicious soups. Over the next few months, he will be seeking donors of both soups and bowls.

Labate found inspiration in the Empty Bowls Project, an international grassroots hunger movement founded by Lisa Blackburn and John Hartom in Michigan in 1990 and continued by the non-profit organization Imagine/RENDER Group. The idea is simple: potters, students, and other craftspeople hand-make bowls. Guests are invited to a simple meal. In exchange for a small cash donation, guests are given a bowl in remembrance of all those who are hungry. The donations from the event will then go to a charity of choice. Labate would like this effort to support local needs, specifically the Food Bank of the Southern Tier. For more information, visit <http://www.foodbankst.org>.

"This event will not be possible without the help of the willing Alfred community," Labate says. "Not only will we need soups (and other food), but we will need bowls made by the loving hands within the community. For this event, 100 - 200 donated bowls will be needed. Anyone may also donate a bowl as just an auction item, without fear that soup will be placed within pieces of art not intended to be slurped from."

Nick Labate is a sophomore majoring in Art and Design with a minor in education from Cleveland, Ohio. He sees Empty Bowls as a great way to combine the talents surrounding the University's Art School and the incredible generosity of the greater Alfred community.
