Faculty and Staff - the Tuition Exchange Export Application deadline is October 22, 2018. If your child is planning to begin college (or transfer to another college) next year, 2019-20, you may wish to explore the schools participating in the Tuition Exchange (TE) Program. RENEWAL TE Export applications are also subject to the deadline of October 22, 2018.

### **New York State Paid Family Leave Changes for 2019**

The PFL benefit rate will increase from 50% to 55% of an employee's average weekly wage, up to the weekly maximum of \$746.41, for a maximum of 10 weeks (subject to the 52-week lookback). The weekly maximum benefit rate is based on 55% of the state's average weekly wage of \$1,357.11 for 2019.

The contribution rate for employees will also increase in 2019 from .00126% to .00153% of gross wages. The maximum annual employee PFL contribution for 2019 will be \$107.97, up from \$85.56 in 2018.

For example, in 2019, an employee who makes \$1,000 a week would receive a benefit of \$550 a week (55% of \$1,000). Another employee who makes \$2,000 a week would receive a benefit of \$746.41,

because this employee is capped at one-half of New York State's Average Weekly Wage (NYS AWW) of \$1,357.11.

Speaker: Lydia McCarthy

Topic: "Alternative Art Spaces and A Psychedelic Goddess Cult"

In Athens there is an active, young, international art community that has sprung up in the wake of the 2008 economic crisis. Exhibitions open nightly - in studios, apartments, old homes, parks - with a gritty, experimental and DIY culture taking precedence over commercial, market driven spaces. The energy and chaos of the city permeates the art community. In a northern suburb of Athens lies Eleusina, a Culture Capital of Europe in 2021 and the site of the Eleusinian Mysteries, the ancient Greek cult of Demeter and Persephone that was active for over 2,000 years. Psychonauts of the 20th century like Gordon Wasson, Albert Hoffman and Terrence McKenna wrote about the secret ritual of the Greater Mystery, believing that the brew ingested by initiates, kykeon, was psychoactive. I will present my research into these two facets of Greek culture and the work I made during a month-long artist residency.

The Division of Drawing, Painting and Photography is pleased to present visiting artist Livia Corona Benjamin. Livia's work moves fluidly between sculpture and photography, exploring architectural structures and their roll in agriculture, history and cultural identity. In her ongoing series Infinite Rewrite, Livia employs analog manipulation in the color darkroom. She carefully breaks down black and white images of grain silos found throughout the Mexican Republic into colorful patterns that vibrate. Each handmade image allows a glimpse of the original structure and creates a disorienting typology.

Livia Corona Benjamin lives and works between New York, Mexico City and Ensenada, Baja California. She was born in Mexico. Corona Benjamin is a Guggenheim Fellow and a twice honored recipient of a SNCA Endowment for the Arts, granted by Mexico's Commission of Arts and Culture. Her works have been exhibited worldwide including LACMA, Los Angeles; New Museum of Contemporary Art, New York; Museo de Arte Moderno, Mexico City; Institut Valencià d'Art Modern, Spain; Palais des Beaux-Arts, Bruxelles, Belgium; Ballroom Marfa, Texas; Fundació Joan Miró, Palma de Mallorca, Spain; København's Museum, Denmark; and the exhibition Pacha, Llaqta, Wasichay: Indigenous Space, Modern Architecture, New Art, recently on view at the Whitney Museum of American Arts.

Ikebana and Ziggurat are both distinct formalist structures. The work of Ellen Bahr and Kathleen McShane can be located within a conceptual ikebana where space is the prominent compositional element. Using an often pared-down aesthetic, McShane and Bahr share a line of inquiry that focuses on the construction of space, as opposed to a representation of space.

Bahr's temporary, abstract arrangements are influenced by the small studio space where she works and the properties of the materials she manipulates. McShane's drawings are informed by an extended approach to what drawing can be, and often in response to the expansive sense of space she experiences in Texas. The exhibition is a kind of laboratory. In addition to photographs and drawings, each artist will build a "ziggurat" of works by artist who have been mentors and important influences, including Alfred alumni, as well as current and former faculty: Patrick Brennan, Jonathan Faber, Charles Goldman, John Hosford, Whitney Hubbs, Paul Kotula, Mary Lum, Lydia McCarthy, Stephanie McMahon, Ted Morgan, Sally Ross, Jennifer Niederhauser-Schlup, and Linda Sormin.
