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HR Tip of the Month

Did you know that as an employee of Alfred University you may qualify for Public Service Loan Forgiveness?

Qualifying Factors:

- * Must work at least 30 hours a week
- * Your federal loans have to be Direct Loans to qualify
- * Your loans must be paid under an income based repayment plan
- * Have to make 120 on-time qualifying payments then the rest of your loans are forgiven
- * Complete and submit the Employment Certification for Public Service Loan Forgiveness form yearly to your loan servicer to certify your employment
- * Human Resources can certify your employment and verify employment dates
