The 1930s Jazz Age Sculpture of Waylande Gregory

Waylande Gregory is recognized as America's top ceramic artist of the 1930s. His Fountain of the Atom made for the 1939 New York World's Fair, admired by Albert Einstein and countless others, was at that time the world's largest ceramic sculpture of the modern era. Gregory came into his own during what F. Scott Fitzgerald, author of The Great Gatsby, named the Jazz Age.

Saying Glass at Cohen Gallery

January 24-February 23, 2020 Reception: January 24, 5-8pm

Cohen Gallery

Alfred University's Cohen Gallery presents Saying Glass, an exhibition of the work of five Alfred University-affiliated artists working in cast glass, curated by Karen Donnellan.

Saying Glass celebrates two recent developments at Alfred University's School of Art and Design: the appointment of Michael Rogers, whose work is included in the exhibit, as Artistic Associate at SOAD; and the renovation of the National Casting Center glass studios.

The exhibition brings together the work of Rogers and four SOAD alumni: Andrew Erdos (BFA '07), Joanna Manousis (MFA '12), Zora Palova (Randal Chair '16), and Anjali Srinivasan (BFA '02). Their work extends from the gestural and experimental to the meticulously crafted and engineered, and the exhibition reflects the far-reaching edges of the visual, material, and conceptual potential in glass today. The title Saying Glass is a reference to the artist Roni Horn, whose metal and cast-glass sculptures are meditations on the element of water.

The artists featured in Saying Glass:

Andrew Erdos' multi-disciplinary works often combine cast and blown glass, video, photography and installation. Erdos has exhibited internationally at venues including The Toledo Museum of Art; Corning Museum of Glass; National Center for Contemporary Art, Moscow; Beijing BS1 Contemporary Art Center; and the Kemper Museum.

Joanna Manousis is a British-American artist working in glass and mixed media. Her work has been recognized with nominations for the Louis Comfort Tiffany Foundation Award, a Bombay Sapphire Award Nomination for 'Excellence in Glass' as well as the Hans Godo Frabel Award.

Zora Palova was born in Bratislava, Czechoslovakia, in 1947. She studied at the Academy of Fine Arts, Bratislava, specializing in painting and later in glass and architecture. She became President of the Association of Applied Arts and Designers in 1995 and Research Professor at the University of Sunderland in 1996.

Michael Rogers recently retired as Professor in the Studio Arts Glass Program at the Rochester Institute of Technology. Previously he returned to the United States after spending eleven years in Japan where he was head of Glass at Aichi University.

Anjali Srinivasan's studio processes focus on developing ways to discover, access and restructure information held in a material. She is currently invested in notions of "biological craftsmanship". She lives and works between India and the United States, as Assistant Professor at Massachusetts College of Art and Design, Boston, and Director at ChoChoMa Studios, Bangalore.

Saying Glass has been curated by Alfred University Assistant Professor of Glass Karen Donnellan. Born in Wicklow, Ireland, Donnellan also serves as director of the National Casting Center glass facility at the New York State College of Ceramics at Alfred University. Her work is held in public and private collection and has been shown at venues internationally, including the Corning Museum of Glass; the Irish Museum of Contemporary Art; Tushanwan Museum, Shanghai; and the National Glass Center, Sunderland, England.

Guest artist Jenise Akilah Anthony is a native of Trinidad and Tobago and currently erves as Assistant Professor of African Dance and Artistic Director of Sankofa African Dance and Drum Ensemble at the College at Brockport, State University of New York. She has been a dance educator and choreographer for over ten years, working both nationally and internationally. She is renowned for her African Diaspora dance work and tutelage that is hinged in both traditional and contemporary African dance genres such as West African, Caribbean Folk, Modern Afro-Caribbean, and Afro-Modern.

Cohen Gallery is pleased to present an exhibition of ceramics and drawings by Robin Caster Howard. On view in the locals gallery, the exhibition opens with a reception on Thursday, February 13 from 5:00 pm - 8:00 pm and will remain on view until March 1, 2020.

Robin Caster Howard was born in Brooklyn, New York in 1951, a descendent of Russian and Polish immigrants. Robin received her BFA from Massachusetts College of Art in 1984 and her MFA from the New York College of Ceramics at Alfred University in 1986. For several years, while living in New York City, she developed a jewelry business, selling her hand-crafted work to museums and boutiques. In 1993, she began working for Alfred University, initially as an assistant to the then director of the Ceramic Museum of Art and subsequently as Assistant Dean of the School of Art and Design, where she remained until her retirement in 2016. Since then, she has been working full-time in her studio. Robin lives in Alfred with her husband, Ben Howard, Emeritus Professor of English at Alfred University.

The rich textures, playful colors and intuitive process in Robin's work is at once fresh and skillful. About her work Robin states: "For years I have included images of birds and flowers in my work. I have also explored the themes of death and loss. In the past few years, however, as the presence of an environmental crisis has become more immediate, the presence of nature-and the existential threat to nature as we know it-has become more prominent in my work."

Make Sure You are Registered to Vote

With the 2020 primary and general elections approaching, I encourage all eligible Alfred University students, faculty, and staff to exercise their right to vote. Alfred University's history of supporting voter enfranchisement includes Abigail Allen's 1887 arrest and subsequent indictment for illegally casting a ballot. Abigail Allen, the wife of then-Alfred University President Jonathan Allen, was one of 22 female students in our inaugural class (versus 14 male students) and an outspoken advocate for women's rights, including the right to vote. The All-In Campus Democracy Challenge awarded Alfred University a Silver Seal for our recently improved student voting rate, which was 29.7% for the 2018 election cycle. We hope to see that rate continue to increase for the 2020 election cycle.
