Important news from President Edmondson

I am writing to advise you that late week, I received a subpoena from the Office of the Attorney General of the State of New York. The subpoena requires that Alfred University submit the bulk of our records for student healthcare insurance programs from 2003 to the present. We had received no prior communication from the Attorney General's office about this subject, and the subpoena cited neither a reason for the investigation nor specific acts or policies that may have precipitated an investigation. We will, of course, comply with the subpoena. Because subpoenas from the Attorney General are frequently the subject of press coverage, we thought that the community should be informed promptly.

Some of you may be aware that in November of 2008, Attorney General Andrew Cuomo issued

subpoenas to several prominent institutions (Cornell and Brown, among others) on this general topic. We do not yet know how many other institutions may also have been included in this round of subpoenas. In November, the items mentioned by Attorney General Cuomo as being problematic were (1) undisclosed relationships between employees of colleges and universities and insurance companies and (2) practices of requiring students to purchase college health insurance plans but not allowing waivers to students with private coverage.

It is important to make clear that Alfred University requires that students show proof of healthcare insurance. Like many institutions we bill our students for low cost insurance that we offer, but we permit any students who are covered by private insurance to opt out simply by completing a waiver request (available on online). To our knowledge, no University employee has a financial relationship with any insurance company. Since the subpoena identified no individuals, practices, programs or acts that are under scrutiny, there is little else for us to say at the moment.

Many of you will recall that about a year ago the Attorney General issued a similar subpoena requiring the submission of our records on international programs since 2005. We complied fully, at a significant cost and burden for our staff. To date, we have received no communication at all regarding the status of this matter . The current subpoena will also impose a real burden on us.

If we receive additional information, we will share it with you.

Pottery water filters and pottery cook stoves are seriously needed, in much of the so-called third world. A tiny amount of silver in a pottery filter prevents E coli and other pathogens, thus preventing the diarrheal illnesses.

Pottery stoves, which are insulating, seriously reduce the indoor air pollution of three-rock fires. The World Health Organization has found that pottery offers a synergistic approach to the management of the health projects, related to the water and the air.

The Global Awareness Roundtable is a monthly event designed to introduce the Alfred community to a variety of cultures from around the world. This informal gathering gives our international faculty, students and alumni the opportunity to introduce participants to countries as diverse as Japan, Guatemala and Tunisia. The University's representative from Wegmans has notified me that during the flu season any prescription for generic oral antibiotics from Jan. 7, 2009 through Tuesday, March 31, 2009, covering a 14 day supply will be free of charge including any refills. All you need to have is a Shoppers Club Card.

The following is a list of the free prescriptions: Amoxicillin, Cephalexin, Sulfarnethoxazole/trimethoprim, Ciprofloxacin, Penicillin VK, Tetracycline, Ampicillin, Erythromycin Stearate and Ethylsuccinate, and Doxycycline Hyclate (capsules).
