Open Enrollment for Statutory Employees

This is a reminder that the open enrollment period from Monday, Nov. 14 through Wednesday, Nov. 30, 2011 applies to all regular Statutory employees as well. Contributory Life, Voluntary Accident, Vision and Flex Spending plans are provided by Alfred University, not the State, so if you wish to add or make changes to any of these, requests need to be made during this period and will be effective January 1st, 2012.

Remember, Flexible Spending Accounts must be re-affirmed even if you do not wish to make a change from 2011 levels.

The State has not announced the Open Enrollment dates or the new rates for the Health Plans yet. Please see attached for all the information we have received to date from the State concerning the changes allowed during the State's Option Transfer period.

E-mail and Telephone Scams

There have been quite a few different scams out on campus via e-mail and telephone.

The most recent is the e-mailed Delta Airline scam. The e-mail shows a flight that was booked with actual Delta Web site and telephone numbers but no name is listed. What they want you to do is click on one of the links listed in e-mail for the flight information. Delta was called and they said to immediatly delete the e-mail, it is a scam.

Others were from Apple regarding the biography of Steve Jobs and the overseas e-mails are still thriving requesting your banking information.

The best action to take regarding these e-mails is to delete them immediately.

As for any telephone calls, just forward them to Office and Procurement Services at x2698.

You can also block these e-mails by going to your Barracuda e-mail filter and block them. The instructions to do this are attached.

Chemical Waste Removal Fall 2011

The fall/winter chemical waste removal will occur during December 2011. Both hazardous and non-regulated waste will be accepted.

All chemical waste must be received in your respective Central Accumulation Area (CAA) no later than Thursday, Dec. 1, 2011. Advanced Waste Solutions will be packaging for transport beginning Tuesday, Dec. 6, 2011.

NYSCC contact Dean x3020 (Harder Hall CAA) or Shanti x2497 (McMahon CAA); non-statutory AU contact Dean x3020 (Myers Hall CAA) to arrange for receipt of your waste.

All Satellite Accumulation Area labels MUST be filled out completely with EPA# for respective college, building name, Room # or area name, start date, initials, chemical name(s) of constituents in the accumulation container with volume or weight, and waste characteristics prior to receipt in Central Accumulation.

Note: Per EPA regulations you have only 72 hours from an SAA full date to transfer the container to the proper CAA. SAA containers must be capped or sealed with container lid, have clean exterior, and

SAA label easily legible.

If you have any questions contact Dean Perry.

All Satellite Accumulation Areas (SAA) must be empty prior to Thursday, Dec. 1, 2011 with a notation to that effect made on your submitted December 2011 Satellite Accumulation Area Weekly Inspection sheets.

Completed Hazardous Waste and Non-Regulated Waste Log Forms must be completed at the time the SAA waste is brought to the CAA or sent to Dean Perry no later than Tuesday, Nov. 29, 2011, and may be mailed - 117 Myers Hall, faxed - x2086, or e-mailed - perrydr@alfred.edu.

Advanced Waste must have this information prior to packing in order to obtain required approvals from the TSDF. Required forms are available at http://our.alfred.edu/ind... under the heading "AU EH&S Forms".

You may still accumulate waste and add to your list notifying Dean of the additional waste by faxing or e-mailing a NEW waste log sheet adding the word "Amended" to the title no later than Thursday, Dec. 1, 2011.

If you have not yet submitted your 2011 chemical inventory (due June 15, 2011) or updated your MSDS's and MSDS Online database, please do so by Tuesday, Dec. 20, 2011.
