Bang Geul Han, AU Class of 2005, is currently presenting a solo exhibition "FORGET GRAMMAR THINK POTATOES" at the Gibson Gallery in The Art Museum at the State University of New York at Potsdam through Saturday, March 28, 2015.

Gallery notes read: "Working within the confluence of linguistic, social and technical forms of language and convention, Bang Geul Han aims to both explore and blur the coded spaces dividing understandings of fiction and non-fiction, and public and private. Focusing on the permeable and elastic nature of translations and transitions, her work examines the contradiction of linguistic and technological systems as sites of totalizing standardization, as well as fertile grounds for subversion and creativity."

Bang has received many fellowships and completed artist residencies, including at the Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculpture, the MacDowell Colony, and the Lower Manhattan Cultural Council's Workspace Program. She is an assistant professor in the Digital Arts and Sciences Program at Clarkson University, Potsdam.
