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Russell Lecture

The Human Studies Division, College of Liberal Arts & Sciences, welcomes Dr. William D. Irvine as this year's Russell Lecturer, Thursday, March 21 at 7:30 p.m. in the Nevins Theater, Powell Campus Center.

Irvine will present "Looking for Fascism in All the Wrong Places." Admission to the event is free and the public is welcome.

Irvine, professor emeritus of history at York University, Toronto, is widely recognized as one of the most influential scholarly voices in the history of France and the history of Fascism during the last 30 years.

Some of his major works include "French Conservatism in Crisis: The Republican Federation of France in the 1930s" (1979); "The Boulanger Affair Reconsidered: Royalism, Boulangism, and the Origins of the Radical Right in France" (1988); and most recently, "Between Justice and Politics: The Ligue des Droits de L'Homme, 1898-1945" (2007), which has forced a rethinking of the history of human rights in France.

The Russell Lecture, held anually since 1970, honors the memory of Willis Russell, former historian and department chair, who taught at Alfred University from 1926 until his retirement in 1964.
