A couple of months after graduating high school he was helping to run a mixed-media performance troupe in Europe. Phil Niblock Music Composition Performance

Phill Niblock (b. 1933, USA) is an artist whose fifty-year career spans minimalist and experimental music, film and photography. Since 1985, he has served as director of Experimental Intermedia, a foundation for avant-garde music based in New York with a branch in Ghent, and curator of the foundation's record label XI. Known for his thick, loud drones of music, Niblock's signature sound is filled with microtones of instrumental timbres that generate many other tones in the performance space. In 2013, his diverse artistic career was the subject of a retrospective realised in partnership between Circuit (Contemporary Art Centre Lausanne) and Muster de l'Elyster. The following year Niblock was honored with the prestigious Foundation for Contemporary Arts John Cage Award.
