Alumna to present next Bergren Forum on gravity and space 2/23/12

The Alfred University Bergren Forum presents "How Not to Fall Down a Black Hole," a talk by Rachel (Lash) Maitra, AU class of 2001, at 12:10 p.m. in Nevins Theater, Powell Campus Center, Thursday, March 1. The program is open to the public free of charge. Maitra, visiting assistant professor of physics at Albion College, Albion, Mich., will focus on the relationship between gravity and space-time and argue the question; Can microscopic space-time foam save us when gravity gets too extreme?
