**Prior to Break, Be Alert**

Traditionally, there has been an increase in thefts the week before Spring Break on the Alfred University campus. Below you will find some tips to help you keep your property safe.

### **Lecture: Impressions of China - An American in Beijing**

Professor Gan will share his experiences on a 2010 summer journey through China. He hopes that he can dispel many false perceptions that Americans entertain about the Chinese in this illustrated talk.

He traveled, in his 2,000 mile trip, to four cities, representing the newest and oldest aspects of Chinese culture. He saw the World Exposition in Shanghai, the Great Wall, and the Terra Cotta Soldiers. During his journey by taxi, private car, rail, and air, Gan spoke about Ghandi at two universities and spent time in three different households.

This library-sponsored lecture is free and open to the general public.
