## Former professor, wine expert Dr. Carl Shively dies

Dr. Carl E. Shively, a professor of microbiology and biochemistry at AU for 30 years, died Sunday, July 12, 2015.

Carl, who retired from the University in 1998, was considered an expert on details of sparkling wine production as well as the still and sparkling wines of New York State and Australia. In particular, he did research attempting to decrease time in the barrel for sparkling wines while also attaining the sensory qualities associated with those that had been aged three-five years.

He was a member of Union University Church, Alfred; the American Wine Society; and the American Society for Enology and Viticulture. Carl was a certified wine judge in all of the United States, Canada, and Australia. He won numerous awards for amateur wines and champagnes in national wine competitions.
