Student Payroll Documents

Students, Welcome back to Alfred!

If you have never worked on campus before and intend on securing a work study or non-work study job you will need documents to complete your Human Resources paperwork. Without these necessary documents your job cannot be entered into the Banner system and you cannot start working.

Work Study Students Need: EAC Card from Financial Aid, completed by your Supervisor Wage Statement from your Supervisor or Human Resources W4 (HR will provide this) Bank account number and routing number for direct deposit Appropriate I-9 documents (these documents must be originals, copies are not accepted!)

Non-Work Study Students Need: Student Payroll Authorization Form completed by your Supervisor Wage Statement from your Supervisor or Human Resources W4 (HR will provide this) Bank account number and routing number for direct deposit Appropriate I-9 documents (these documents must be originals, copies are not accepted!)

If you are an international student additional documentation needed: Passport Visa Social Security Card or Letter of Application I-94 I-20

Please see the attached document regarding what is an acceptable document for I-9. The I-9 is a government form that verifies that you have the right to work in the United States. These documents are what hold most students up with having their job entered, because they do not have them. If you do not have them and want to work, you will need to get them sent here to complete your paperwork. You cannot begin work until we have these documents.

Environmental Studies Speaker- Stewart Diemont

Friday, September 21 from 12:20 pm - 1:10 pm

"What do Indigenous and Local Cultures Tell Us About Conserving and Restoring Ecosystems?" will be the talk given by Stewart Diemont for the Environmental Studies Speaker Series. Stewart Diemont is an Associate Professor in the Department of Environmental and Forest Biology at the State University of New York, College of Environmental Science and Forestry. He works with indigenous and local people to better understand how traditional knowledge can be part of ecosystem design. With his students and the people of the communities in which he works, he has studied soil, plants, fungi, insects, and birds, as well as talked extensively with community members. He has worked with Mayan communities in Mexico, Belize and Guatemala; Zapotec in Mexico; Haudenosaunee of New York; and with traditional vineyard growers in Europe. His ecosystem design focuses on connecting people with place. He is interested in how food can be a part of ecosystem restoration in cities and rural areas.
