Student Sign-Up For NY-Alert

Alfred University has initiated the NYS Alert system which provides emergency notification through e-mail, text, cell, and phone messages. All full-time students are required to register for the NYS Alert system when BannerWeb is initially accessed.

The minimum registration requirement for all full-time students will be an AU e-mail address, however, there will be options for registering other methods of communication as well.

Part-time students will have the option to register if they choose. Starting Aug. 20, full-time students will see a link to complete Emergency Alert contact information as soon as they login to BannerWeb. Part-time students will find the link "Emergency Alert Contact Information" under the "Personal Information" tab in BannerWeb. The link to BannerWeb is <http://banweb.alfred.edu>.

Web Time Entry of Time Sheets Continues On!

As most of you are aware, we implemented Web time entry (WTE) using BannerWeb last fall for our hourly student workers. We have continued to expand this functionality to include many of our temporary positions including our summer hires. Our ultimate goal is to have accurate recording of time worked for all employees with a paperless timekeeping system.

As the new semester begins, it is expected that ALL STUDENTS, INCLUDING GRADUATE STUDENTS WILL BE FILLING OUT ELECTRONIC TIME SHEETS VIA BANNERWEB.

If you are a student working on campus (work study, non-work study or receiving a stipend for graduate work), or if you are a supervisor and will be hiring and approving a student worker, visit the link below to view Power Points and Instructions for this process.

Visiting artist: Gregory Sholette

Gregory Sholette, a New York-based artist, writer, and founding member of the artists' collectives Political Art Documentation/Distribution and REPOhistory, will speak at 5 p.m. Thursday in Holmes Auditorium, Harder Hall. His lecture, which is part of the School of Art & Design's Visiting Artists' Series, is open to the public, free of charge.

Sholotte is co-editor of *The Interventionists: A Users Manual for the Creative Disruption of Everyday Life* (MassMoCA/MIT Press, 2004, 2006) with Nato Thompson, and of *Collectivism After Modernism: The Art of Social Imagination after 1945* with Blake Stimson, (University of Minnesota, 2007). He frequently collaborates with the artist Janet Koenig and is currently working on a book about the political economy of the art world and his concept of creative dark matter for Pluto Press. He is Assistant Professor of Sculpture in the Department of Art and Art History at Queens College.

REPOhistory (1989-2000) www.repohistory.org An artists' collective that produced over a dozen collaborative art projects primarily in public locations including New York City and Atlanta, Georgia. The group's mission was to develop site-specific, informational work about the unknown or forgotten histories of working class men and women, of minorities and children. REPOhistory used metal street signs, free maps and the mass media to distribute its counter-historical information.
