The last recital of the Wingate Summer Carillon Series will feature Sharon Hettinger, Director of Music and Organist at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Kansas City, Missouri. She began her carillon study under the tutelage of world-renown carillonneur Bert Gerken at the University of Kansas in Lawrence, where she continues to play. Hettinger received her Master of Music (Organ/Church Music) and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees (Organ Performance) from the University of Kansas. Her Bachelor of Music degree is from Westminster Choir College, Princeton, NJ.

This free recital which starts at 7 pm on Tuesday, August 2, has a wide mix of music: a toccata, a capriccio, a jazz suite, a hymn tune set and an arrangement of "Home on the Range." The recital will be held rain or shine. Indoor seating will be available in Howell Hall in the event of rain.
