The exam will take place from 10-11:25 a.m.;, participants and their teachers are then invited to a lunch in Ade Dining Hall prior to the awards presentation at 12:30 p.m. in McLane Center.

The competition is open to all high school students, regardless of home district or grade level. The winner will receive a scholarship if he or she enrolls at Alfred University. First, second and third-place winners from the junior/senior competition will receive scholarships totaling \$10,000, \$8,000 and \$6,000 respectively, divided over four years. There also are cash prizes for the top three scorers in the Junior/ Senior competition and the Sophomore Competition (10th and lower).
