Schultz invited to join International Academy of Law and Mental Health 8/22/07

Dr. Pamela D. Schultz, associate professor of Communications Studies in the College of Liberal Arts & Sciences at Alfred University, has been nominated to join the International Academy of Law and Mental Health. The invitation to join came after Schultz presented two papers at the 30th Congress of International Academy of Law and Mental, held earlier this summer in Padua, Italy.
