## Open Enrollment Nov. 7 - 30, 2006

The Open Enrollment period allows employees to make changes to or enroll in benefits effective Jan. 1, 2007. Unless the employee experiences a "change of family status," this is the only time of year to change these benefits.

The following benefits you may enroll in, drop coverage, or make changes to current level of coverage:

Health Insurance Life Insurance Accident Insurance Dental Insurance Vision Plan

Flexible Spending Accounts -- Must enroll for the 2007 year to participate in Medical or Dependent Care Flex Spending.

## Non-Statutory Health Insurance Changes

The rate increase for 2007 for Alfred University (excluding the Ceramics College which is still pending

from the State) will be 3.1% for the POS 203, and 7.8% for Traditional.

Changes to be implemented as of Jan. 1, 2007

- \* Reduce Employer Contribution for Traditional Blue 901 Plan to 75% of Lowest Cost Plan. Traditional Blue 901 Premiums effective January 1, 2007, will be \$101.89 for Single coverage and \$178.58 for Family coverage per pay period.
- \* Offer both Traditional 901 and POS 203 to the Retiree Group.
- \* Decrease the Employer Contribution for Two-Employee Coverage from 85% to 80% effective January 2007, with other reductions following in subsequent years.

There will be a representative on campus to discuss the insurance plans so that employees may compare coverage, making the best choice for how they use their health insurance. Meetings will be held in the Kenyon/Allen/Davis Room in Powell Campus Center according to the following schedule:

Wednesday, Nov. 8 -- 8:30 a.m., 10 a.m., 1 p.m., and 2:30 p.m.

Thursday, Nov. 16 -- 8:30 a.m., 1 p.m., and 2:30 p.m.

Tuesda, y Nov. 28 -- 1:30 p.m. and 3 p.m.

Any changes to coverage will need to be made during the Open Enrollment period. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Human Resources Office.

## Operation Christmas Child

You know how happy you were as a kid when someone handed you a present? Well, there are children all over the world who have never known that happiness, because no one has ever given them a gift. This Christmas, you have the chance to change that.

Operation Christmas Child is a project (run by Samaritan's Purse, a nonprofit org.) where people throughout the United States fill shoeboxes with small gifts and send them to needy children around the world. Please, be one of those people, and make a child's day.

If you decide to make a shoebox, here are some guidelines: toys and candy are fine, but these kids also need items like toothbrushes and toothpaste, soap, shoes, and clothes. There should be nothing that will remind them of war, many of these kids have seen enough of that already. It is nice if the boxes are wrapped, but they do not have to be. If you do wrap it, please make sure that the lid can be taken off without damaging the wrap job. Please put a slip of paper inside the box indicating whether your box is for a boy or a girl and a general age range (gifts are sent to kids from 3-14 yrs old).

There is a shipping cost of \$7, which the organization asks you to put in the box as well. If you cannot afford to pay for both the box and the shipping fee, you could split the cost with some friends, or you could donate some money to help send someone else's box over.
