Dear Alfred University Community,

The Alfred University 2015 -16 Annual Campus Safety & Fire Report is now available and attached. This report is required by federal law to be published by October 1 for the previous calendar year and

contains policy statements and crime statistics for our school. The policy statements address Alfred's policies, procedures and programs concerning safety and security, for example, policies for responding to emergency situations and sexual offenses. Three years' worth of statistics are included for certain types of crimes that were reported to have occurred on campus, in or on off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by the school and on public property within or immediately adjacent to the campus. Please note the federal law requires that we count specific crimes by calendar year, not academic year.

You may also request a paper copy from the Office of Public Safety or Dean of Student's Office.

Resin Bonded Sand Molding Workshop with Morgan Donohue

Monday Oct 10th and 11th 2016

National Casting Center Foundry

Morgan Donohue: Master Sand Mold Technician from World Renowned Polich Tallix Foundry will be joining us at the National Casting Center Foundry. He will be working with students on patterns to be cast in Iron at the annual 'MeltDown' Iron Pour.

If you are simply intrigued or have a molding question or pattern you are welcome to join us for any of the sessions listed below.

If you have a pattern that you are interested to cast please bring it to one of the tech sessions on Monday and follow up with another session on Tuesday. Your pattern can be made out of plasticine, found or altered object. A pattern is what we will start with to make the mold. Plan to attend two sessions, one on Monday and one on Tuesday to get the full experience and technical advice of how to move forward with your mold.

Monday is for mold making discussion, technical problem solving and planning. Tuesday we hope to begin making the molds, mixing sand and ramming the first parts. There will be a cost for materials such as sand and iron. You may be required to purchase other materials such as wood, bolts, steel etc. depending upon your individual project needs.

Session 1: Monday- 8:20-11:30am Session 2: Monday- 1:30-4:30pm Session 3: Monday- 6-9pm Session 4: Tuesday- 8:20-11:30am Final Session: Tuesday- 1:30pm - 4pm

You will be left with a plan to follow in order to complete your mold. Morgan will be returning for the week leading up to 'MeltDown' Oct 24th - 28th to assist with finishing the molds ready to be cast in Iron on Sat 29th Oct.

Currently working at Pollich-Tallix, Morgan Donohue has 28 years' of sand mold making experience. He has molded and cast ambitious sculptures by Von Rydingsvard, Otterness, Koons, Shapiro, Oldenburg, Noguchi and the DiVinci Horse, to name a few. His work is found in Washington, D.C. at the FDR Memorial, Japanese Internment Camp Memorial, the Korean War Memorial and the Holocaust Museum. Traveling around the world, his work can be found in sculpture parks, sports venues and municipal installations.

The Division of Drawing, Painting and Photography is please to present visiting artist Gina Beavers. Instagram culture and trends become thick, sculptural objects in Beavers tromp l'oiel paintings. Grids of how-to make-up posts are subject to deftly built up surfaces, layering paint to the point of no return. Bulging surfaces of a lobster roll turn what may have been a proud show-and-tell of a trip to Maine into what could quickly become grotesque and gluttonous - her playful choice of color and image avoid finger pointing. Beavers' work acknowledges her own participation (and celebration?) of this image saturated world.

Gina Beavers' work has been widely exhibited, nationally and internationally, including group shows at CANADA, Nicelle Beauchene and Zach Feuer in New York as well as Night Gallery in LA and Cooper Cole in Toronto. In 2015 Beavers was included in the 'Greater New York' exhibition at MoMA PS1. Her work has been reviewed in Frieze, Artforum, the LA Times and the New York Times, among others. Beavers is represented by Clifton Benevento in Los Angeles.
