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For Students Only: H1N1 News

For AU students at high-risk for influenza-related complications, a limited supply of H1N1 vaccine is now available at Health Services. Only AU students at high-risk due to pre-existing medical conditions can be served at this time.

Please refer to the list below to determine who is at high-risk.

High-risk students are asked to call 607.871.2400 for an appointment. Appointments are required. The H1N1 vaccine appointments will be available between 1 and 4 p.m. on 11/18, 11/19, 11/20, and 11/23.

If you schedule an appointment, please be sure that you have eaten and are feeling well before receiving the vaccination. It is not advised that anyone receive the vaccination if ill, have a cold, or have flu-like symptoms.

According to the Centers for Disease Control, the high-risk group includes those students with the following medical conditions:

- * Pregnancy (with your doctor's recommendation)
- * Asthma
- * Neurological and neuro-developmental conditions (such as seizure disorders, muscular dystrophy, or spinal cord injury)
- * Chronic lung disease (such as cystic fibrosis)
- * Heart disease (such as congenital heart defects)
- * Diabetes
- * Kidney disorders
- * Liver disorders
- * Metabolic disorders
- * Blood disorders (such as sickle cell)
- * Weakened immune system due to disease or medication (such as those on long-term steroid treatment or people with HIV, AIDS)

If you are unsure about your risk status please call the Wellness Center at 607.871.2400 and our staff will help you decide.

Open Enrollment for 2010 will end this Friday, Nov. 20.

The Open Enrollment period allows employees to make changes to or enroll in benefits effective Jan. 1, 2010. Unless the employee experiences what is known as a "life event" throughout the year, this is the only time you may make any changes to these benefits.

You may enroll in, make changes to your current level of coverage, or drop your coverage for the following benefits:

Health Insurance (there are changes for 2010 that may affect you)

Life Insurance - New offerings and lower prices for voluntary additional life, Spousal Life is also available

Accident Insurance

Dental Insurance - New Plan with immediate coverage for major services

Vision Plan

Flexible Spending Accounts - You must enroll or re-enroll for the 2010 year to participate in Medical or Dependent Flex Spending. A new "Debit Card" feature to make it easier to use your account.

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Attention Retirees

Due to the holiday many of you did not receive our invitation to the Wednesday meeting to discuss changes to the 2010 medical and life insurance plans. We do apologize and will be holding another "Retiree Only" meeting on Thursday, Nov. 19, 2009 at 2:30 p.m. in Nevins Theater in the Powell Campus Center.

At this meeting you will have the chance to hear from our insurance providers about changes to the Prescription Drug coverage for all plans and new co-pay arrangements for the POS Plans. I have outlined some of the changes below so that you can be prepared to ask questions about how the plan changes will affect your particular situation:

- * For retirees of the Non-Statutory Colleges who participate in the University sponsored plans all plans will have the same Rx program. The plans have three levels of co-pays depending on the drug that is being prescribed. Those co-pays are: \$10 for generic medications, \$20 for most brand name drugs and \$40 for other brand name and specialty drugs.
- * The Rx coverage is no longer subject to a maximum for the year in the "Traditional Plan" and you do not have to meet your deductible before you have Rx coverage.
- * There are new Co-Pays in the POS Plan for the first "in-hospital" admission and Emergency Services. There are also new services that have not been available before or have been increased. These include additional treatment days for physical, occupational and speech therapy, the addition of coverage for prosthetic and orthotics and unlimited skilled nursing facility coverage.
- * The Life Insurance provided to retirees at no charge has been expanded to include Spouses and Domestic Partners up to age 70 at a \$2000 level.

These summarize the significant changes in the plans. For those who maintain dependent coverage, the premiums will reduce slightly as of January 1, 2010. If you are in the area and able to attend the session, we welcome the opportunity to meet with you and address any questions you might have. For those who are out-of-the-area or unable to attend, please feel free to contract the Human Resource Office at 607-871-2909 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and we would be happy to answer any questions you might have and assist you with your plan selection.
