Former AU Major Gift Officer, 1997-08, Rich Simington Dies

Rich Simington's son Jeremy has informed the campus that his father, Rich Simington, former major gift officer in AU's University Relations Division, died March 30, 2016 in Seneca, SC.

Shortly before Rich retired in 2007 after nearly 11 years on staff, former VP Stan Colla wrote: "Rich Simington likes to say that he 'came to Alfred as a stranger' when he was brought in to establish a planned giving program for the University in 1997. Now nearly 11 years later, it is clear that Rich is no longer a stranger to this campus, or, in fact, to Alfred's alumni." During his career at AU Rich brought in more than \$40 million in gifts. While in the Alfred community Rich was a volunteer ambulance driver and fire police officer.

A celebration of life service will be held at Seneca (SC) Presbyterian Church at 2 p.m. on Saturday, May 28, 2016. Friends are invited to attend.

Rich is survived by his beloved son Jeremy, Pennsylvania; Jeremy's mother Christine Banes Simington, Pennsylvania; his sisters Nancy and Anne Simington, New York; and his cousins Lt. Col. Elaine (Simington) Rich, Ret., South Carolina, Grace (Simington) Karschner, Pennsylvania, and Major Edith (Simington) Shepherd, Ret., New York.
