Latin-American Music Duo Gonzalez/Guarin to Perform Sat. Nov. 23

This Saturday, Nov. 23 at 7:30 PM in Miller Theater, MostArts Festival violin soloist Blanca Cecilia Gonzalez and guitarist Nilko Andreas Guarin, will take audiences on a musical journey, providing a taste of Latin-American and European folk Music in a concert titled "Back to the Roots."

The duo will share their knowledge of how traditional music has been an important influence and source of inspiration throughout the years and how the folkloric element has influenced the development of classical music.

Coming from Latin-America, the New York City based the duo will lead an interactive presentation that will focus on the exploration of sounds, rhythms, and melodies hailing from the Andes region in South America, as well as finding linear connections with other parts of the world with similar musical history.

They will explore all of these musical elements with their violin and guitar, as well as their voices. The human voice and poetry, as well as instruments such as these are timeless and universal and play an important role in the evolution of humanity.

Composers include: A. Piazzolla, (Argentina) B. Bartok, (Hungary), N. Paganini, (Italy), Jose A. Morales,

Fulgencio Garcia, Nilko A. Guarin, (Colombia)

Renowned artists, Blanca Cecilia Gonzalez (Violin) and Nilko Andreas Guarin (Guitar). The duo have been performing as soloists and chamber musicians in different stages around the world, and with different orchestras and ensembles. They have come together as a duo with the purpose of exploring and contributing to preserve this millenary, enchanting and intimate, nevertheless, humble music ensemble.
