### **Safety tips for walking on ice**

Please use extreme caution when traveling by foot or vehicle in and around the construction areas on campus. Pay special attention to the crosswalk area near the McMahon bldg. as well as the driveways between Perlman Hall and Myers Hall and Powell Campus Center. The construction vehicles are doing their best to look out for pedestrians; however, they also need your help in paying attention to dangerous situations. Do not cross behind any construction vehicle or delivery truck unless you have been told to do so by one of the traffic spotters. If there is no spotter, you must cross in front of the vehicle after you have the driver's attention and their vehicle is stopped.

### **Byrdcliffe Artist in Residence Program**

The Woodstock Byrdcliffe Guild offers month long Artist in Residence (AIR) opportunities for visual artists, composers, playwrights/screenwriters, and writers of fiction, nonfiction and poetry. Longer residencies are available for ceramic artists. The AIR sessions generally occur during the months of June, July, August, and September. The Woodstock Byrdcliffe Guild's goal is to provide solitude in a community and uninterrupted time in which to concentrate on creative work alongside fellow artists. Opened in 1903, the Byrdcliffe Art Colony was placed on the National Register of Historic Sites in 1979 for its architectural and historical significance. It is located in the Catskill Mountains, 1.5 miles from the center of Woodstock, New York.
