Artist in Residence - Don Metz

Don Metz (Associate Director/Head of Technical Services, Burchfield-Penney Art Center) has worked at the BPAC since 1996, serving as Acting Director from 1996-1998 and as Director of Administration from 1995-2003, today serving as the Head of Public Programs. Throughout his career he has curated a variety of media arts exhibitions and inter-disciplinary performances, and from 1982-1995 he served as the Music Director at Hallwalls Contemporary Arts Center. He has held a variety of administrative positions at the Buffalo Philharmonic Choir, June In Buffalo, and the North American New Music Festival. An active musician, he has been composing and performing his music since completing his studies at the State University of New York at Buffalo in 1977. His music has been performed by the S.E.M. Ensemble, Percusso Argaro from Brazil, The Composers Alliance of Buffalo, the U.B. Percussion Ensemble, The New Jazz Orchestra of Buffalo, Los Caribes, various solo artists, Bufluxus and the East Buffalo Media Association. In 1978, Metz formed the East Buffalo Media Association, creating Inter-Media presentations with writers and artists from the western New York area. Over the past 20 years Metz has worked with artists, Andrew Topolski, John Toth, Fred Ciminelli, Andrew Deutsch writers Jeff Filipski and Michael Basinski, and actor Paul Schmidt. As a guitarist, Metz has performed the music of John Cage, Earl Brown, Petr Kotik, Lucas Foss, Jon Gibson, John Bacon Jr., Jackson MacLow, Phil Niblock, LaMonte Young, Michael Coquhoun, and others.

MeltDown : 13th Annual Iron Pour

Date: Saturday, October 26
Time: 2:00 pm til Dusk

We welcome you to come watch the hot and fiery spectacle of melting and casting molten metal. Joining the Alfred crew will be alumni, students and faculty from other universities as well as visiting artists that have travelled afar to create new work in cast iron.

This year Alfred students will be running road furnaces 'MothRa'; Professor Lambert's portable coke fired 100# capacity cupolette alongside alumni Calvin Hubbard's 'Rascoe', a portable 150# capacity cupola. Molten Iron will flow at temperatures up 2650 degrees Fahrenheit and be poured into sand molds to create sculptural works. Some molds will be poured open face so you can witness the molten iron as it cools.

Arrive at Dusk to see 'Iron Stars' glowing as part of 'Starry Starry Night'.
