2018-19 FAFSA Filing Deadline 3/15/2018

IMPORTANT: MARCH 15, 2018 IS THE DEADLINE FOR FILING THE 2018-19 FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA).

If you will be a student at AU for the 2018-19 academic year...

It's FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) filing time!

For 2018-19, you don't have to wait until January 1, 2018! The 2018-19 FAFSA became available on October 1, 2017.

You'll need your Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) to sign the 2018-19 FAFSA. Go to <https://fsaid.ed.gov> to create an FSA ID (if you do not already have one).

Proceed to <https://fafsa.gov> to get started with the FAFSA filing.

For 2018-19, you will be using 2016 income information. No need to wait until 2017 tax return is filed!

Use the Data Retrieval Tool on the FAFSA to upload the 2016 income directly from the IRS to more quickly complete the form.

The Alfred University FAFSA school code is 002668.

Upon completion of the FAFSA, you will be directed to "Start your state application" if your home state requires it. For NY State residents, this form is called a TAP Application and is required for TAP and other NY State aid.

For New York State Residents only: Be sure the proper Alfred University TAP school code is listed for both the fall and spring semesters.

Alfred's Code is 0020 for programs in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, School of Business, College of Professional Studies, and Mechanical, Renewable Energy, and Undecided Engineering.

Use code 0960 for all other Engineering Programs and the School of Art and Design.

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Accounting for Time During A Weather Shutdown

Reminder, when the University closes for a weather event such as last Friday you must report that time in a different manner than you would for a regular workday. Unless you are classified as a member of an "Essential Job Group" (normally these would include the Grounds Crews, Snow Removal personnel, Equestrian Barn Assistants, certain ITS positions and certain Resident Life and Health Center personnel) you are to record the day as "excused" time and put a comment on your time sheet as "weather day." If you were required to work due to your classification as "Essential", you should do the same, "Excused" but also list your start and stop times exactly as you would on any other workday. For anyone who had scheduled to be off for any reason (medical, vacation, etc.) you do not enter time as "excused" but rather enter your time in the appropriate category for the planned absence. Your Supervisor must have requested that you report to work and your job must be considered "Essential for the Safety and Security of the Institution and/or Students" to be considered "Essential." Any work performed by non-essential personnel will be paid but no other excused time will be considered. Please contact the Human Resources Department if you have any questions about how to record your time for this weather event.

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HR Tip of the Month

Did you know that the IRS has announced updated retirement plan contribution limits for 2018?

403(b) Plan Contribution Limits:

For 2018, the contribution limit for employees into this type of account is rising from \$18,000 in 2017 to \$18,500 in 2018.

For participants who are age 50 and older, the catch-up contribution amount of \$6,000 has not changed. Meaning that older savers can choose to defer up to \$24,500 of their compensation into their accounts.

Traditional and Roth IRA Contribution Limits:

Nothing has changed in regards to the IRA contribution limits. IRA owners can still contribute up to \$5,500 for the 2018 tax year, with an additional \$1,000 catch-up contribution allowed for individuals age 50 or older. Contributions for 2018 can be made from Jan. 1, 2018 through the April 2019 Tax Day.

What is new at AU with Supplemental Retirement Annuity Accounts (SRA)?

Non-Statutory:

AU now has a new Roth option (post-tax) for Non-Statutory employees for a SRA account, previously we only had a pre-tax option. This SRA account is another account that you can open to save more money for retirement, this is not the same account as your mandatory contribution account. With this type of account we are able to process your contribution as a payroll deduction. If you wish to open a new account you should fill out the form attached and return to Kim Wyant in Human Resources.

Statutory (NYSCC):

If you are a Statutory employee you may also set up a (pre-tax) SRA with TIAA. You will need to contact TIAA at 800-842-2252, visit their website linked below, or by setting up an appointment with an adviser when they are on campus regarding this account. With this type of account we are able to process your contribution as a payroll deduction.

You can also set up a Roth IRA account with TIAA, however, HR cannot process payroll deductions for this type of account at this time. You can fund that account with electronic deposits from your personal bank account.

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Alfred Box of Books Library: Reading & Discussion on James Baldwin's America

SUNY Alfred State and Alfred Box of Books Library with funding and support from Humanities New York will be presenting a Reading and Discussion Program on James Baldwin's America. This six week program will run on each Tuesday afternoon from 5 to 6:30 p.m. March 20 through Tuesday, April 24. This reading series will meet at the Alfred Box of Books Library and will be led by SUNY Distinguished Professor Emeritus Joseph Flynn. Joe introduced the first courses in Afro- American literature at Alfred State in the early 1970s and remains an active scholar in that field.

James Baldwin was an American writer and novelist whose works are socially relevant narratives on race and class struggles in America. Born in Harlem in 1924, the grandson of a slave, Baldwin grew up in poverty. His early experiences gave him a lens for viewing the world and writing on social issues. Notes of a Native Son a collection of essays was published 60 years ago.

Our reading and discussions will focus on Baldwin's essays, poems and short stories and will give participants an opportunity to understand the historical events surrounding Baldwin's writings, his view of race and class struggles in America, and how these conversations are still relevant today.

The New York State College of Ceramics participates in the exhibition Eight University Shows in Shipping Containers, with a survey of current graduate student work with Alfred's indigenous shale.

Naturally occurring deposits of Alfred shale allowed for ceramic industry and subsequently Alfred University to be established in the Village of Alfred New York. Shale is a rock deposit that can be easily ground into a terra cotta clay and incorporated into a multitude of ceramic processes. The Celadon Terra Cotta Co. which was founded in 1889, were the first to use Alfred shale to manufacture architectural components including bricks, ornaments, and roof tiles. Alfred University was established shortly thereafter in 1900 and has been an important hub for ceramic research and innovation in the fields of art and engineering ever since.

This informal showcase celebrates shale as the foundation of Alfred's legacy and the reason it exists today. The artists have been asked to use Alfred Shale in some form, as a clay body, slip, glaze ingredient, or in its naturally-occurring state.
