### 17th Perkins lecture: Sequoia Miller

Sequoia Miller: Wet Clay, Pottery and the Museum as a Forum

The Alfred Ceramic Art Museum established the Dorothy Wilson Perkins Ceramic History Lecture Series in 1998, thanks to a generous endowment gift to the Museum by Dr. Lyle Perkins (BFA Alfred '39; MFA Alfred '47) in memory of his wife, Dr. Dorothy Wilson Perkins (BFA Alfred '39).

Sequoia Miller is a historian, curator, and studio potter. He is the Chief Curator at the Gardiner Museum of Ceramic Art, Toronto, Canada. Miller received a BA in Russian and Art History from Brandeis University and a MA from the Bard Graduate Center for Decorative Arts, Design History, and Material Culture in New York City. Miller received his doctorate in the History of Art from Yale University. His thesis analyzed the connections between ceramics and conceptual art practices on the East and West Coasts of the United States in the 1960s and 1970s. Miller curated *The Ceramic Presence in Modern Art* at the Yale University Art Gallery and authored the accompanying award-winning catalogue. His research also includes sixteenth and seventeenth century German stoneware, English salt-glazed stoneware, and Queen Mary's monumental delftware.

Before reentering academia, Miller was a full-time studio potter for over ten years. Based in the Pacific Northwest, he made one-of-a-kind functional pots for daily use in domestic environments. Miller has exhibited widely and led workshops at craft schools, universities, and art centers.

### Artist In Residence - Joseph Moore

Date: September 16-20

Location: The Institute for Electronic Arts

Joseph Moore is an artist whose conceptually based practice utilizes a variety of techniques and media, from photography to network-based art. His recent work investigates the place of the non-human within the context of photographic history as well as labor, temporality, and surveillance. He has exhibited in venues such as Tel Aviv Museum of Art, Tel Aviv, Israel; Microscope Gallery, Brooklyn, NY; WORM, Rotterdam, The Netherlands; Outlet Fine Art, Brooklyn, NY; Arebyte, London, England; and in collections such as The Rose Goldsen Archive of New Media Art at Cornell. He received his B.F.A. from The Atlanta College of Art and his M.F.A. from Bennington College.

During his residency at IEA Joseph Moore will create a series of print-based works that draw upon material from his long-term project "The Inhabitants." Began in 2014, "The Inhabitants" is an archive of 24-hour recordings made from poorly secured web cameras focused on non-human animals. Though this material Moore considers the place of the non-human animal both as subject and often as material in the history of photography and cinema as well as in current technologies of surveillance.

The Institute for Electronic Art's Experimental Projects Residency is made possible by the New York State Council on the Arts with the support of Governor Andrew M. Cuomo and the New York State Legislature.
