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### New VPN Service and Remote Desktop Changes

#### New VPN Service

ITS has a new VPN service, FortiClient, available now that has replaced the SonicWALL VPN. We are happy to say there are now both Mac and Windows versions available, as well as mobile clients in both the Android Play Store and the Apple Store. More information can be found [here](#).

#### Remote Desktop Changes and Enhanced Information Security

To improve network security, ITS will be implementing some changes to the way that users connect to their workstations over Remote Desktop. Starting August 14th, users will need to first connect to Alfred University's FortiClient VPN service before they will be able to connect to Remote Desktop. Once the VPN is connected, Remote Desktop connections will work exactly as it did prior to the changes. This easy and quick additional step will significantly improve network security from outside threats.

Peer Educators are students that encourage other students to consider the behaviors, attitudes, and actions that guide their lives. Peer Educators are student volunteers who promote health and wellness alongside the supervision of the Health & Wellness Coordinator. AU has two types of Peer Educators:

Sexual Assault Prevention Peer Educators: Assist in the development and implementation of programs and initiatives that promote healthy relationships, positive communication, bystander intervention and consent. Sexual Assault Prevention Peer Educators are trained to provide programming in the Residence Halls, in the class room, and with campus-wide events.

- Make a positive difference in the lives of friends and peers
- Build their resume
- Receive professional training
- Freedom to create model prevention programs
