Camp near Manassas Junction  
Sunday October the 11th 1863  
I now seat my self to write a  
fiew lines to you to let you kno that  
I have not forgotten you I am well  
and hope these fiew lines will finde  
you all well I have not had many  
letters from you lately but I think  
likely my letters has been miss  
carreyed there has been several days  
within the two last weeks that  
our Regiment did not get any  
Male it must have [?]

I am ashamed to send this letter  
for I was a going to have it so nice  
and I leyed it down and the wind  
bliew it in the dirst and nastyed it  
real bad. our Regiment is under  
marching orders but I cannot tell  
how soon we shall leave here nor where  
we shall go to when we leave here  
Richard SS does not yet much  
better yet it is the Diarheah that  
ales him. there is a great deal of that  
complain in the Armeey. tell our  
folkes that Charles is well he and I  
are bothe in Camp today for the first  
time in a great while generly we are one  
on Picket or guard one day the other  
the next day. there is no war news to

tell you so I will close
