Dear Sir

I wish to inform you that we will start for your place on the 20th of this month. I sent you 20 packages of the different sorts of garden seeds. I thought much better to send by mail than to carry with us as it may take us a longer time to reach there than we expect. Anderson and Frazer is at a ranche 35 miles from here. how they are prospering in their business is more than I can tell. I hardly think that their prospects will be so bright as they think for reasons of making fools of themselves, in telling

every body that they were
deserters from the other side of
the line, for people in this country
forms an opinion and weighs
them for what they are worth
I will leave nothing undone in
keeping you posted how to guard
against any inquisitions should the
like ever comes in my knowledge.
