Norma “Annie” L. Boucher, a member of the AU Class of 1992, has just released a personal account “Reinventing Yourself After 40: Norma’s Victorious Journey” which chronicles how Jamaican-born Norma progressed from being a young, single mother with no high school diploma to a top-ranked tennis player (a sport she took up at age 38) with a college degree, all in middle age.

Norma was inducted into the AU Sports Hall of Fame in 2004. Although she has retired from her position as a civil servant, the author enjoys being of service to others, especially the elderly. She hopes that this book will serve as a means of telling her grandchildren about her life for years to come.

Today Norma enjoys playing table tennis several times a week. She does strength training and is considering taking up swimming and karate.
