The access code for using the All-Night Study Room at Herrick Library (also known as the Last Resort) is changing on Monday, Sept. 1. For the new code please contact John Dougherty by e-mail: dougherty@alfred.edu.

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To further improve safety notification and communication, Alfred University is switching from e2Campus to a statewide service called SUNY NY-Alert. SUNY NY-Alert uses multiple communication channels such as text messaging, landline phones, email and fax transmissions to alert campus-community members of emergency situations.

Faculty and staff, who signed-up for e2Campus last year, will need to confirm their personal information to continue receiving campuswide alerts through SUNY NY-Alert.

SUNY NY-Alert is different than the NY-Alert being used by county and state agencies. As a result, if you have signed up for NY-Alert through SEMO (the State Emergency Management Office), you will need to sign-up for SUNY NY-Alert to receive Alfred University emergency communications.

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Student Long-Distance Sales Tax

Effective Sept. 1, 2008, certain fund-raising and other exempt activities that were previously exempt are now subject to state sales tax. This new law includes the taxation of student long-distance telephone calls. As a result of this new tax law, sales tax will be applied to the student telephone bills, beginning with calls made on Sept. 1, 2008.

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Key Points for Doing Web Time Entry

All students are now required to do Web time entry. Paper timesheets will only be allowed if a processing or timing error on BannerWeb prohibits the student from entering the actual hours worked on the correct days. If paper timesheets need to be submitted, they will be processed in the next available payroll.

Timing is critical for entry, submission and approval of electronic time sheets. If deadlines are ignored

or missed, timesheet hours are not pulled into payroll to be processed.

We have created automated e-mails which are generated to all students and approvers to remind you of these impending deadlines.

Timesheets are LEGAL DOCUMENTS which require the student to report his/her actual hours worked and the supervisors to verify that the information is accurate.

HR and Payroll are required to respond to inquiries from agencies, insurance companies, and auditors and our information is based on time sheet reporting. This means that if you leave and return to work on the same day (such as your lunch hour), you must record it as such.

Labor laws require that hourly workers take at least one half-hour break if working more than six hours in one day.

Sholotte is co-editor of *The Interventionists: A Users Manual for the Creative Disruption of Everyday Life* (MassMoCA/MIT Press, 2004, 2006) with Nato Thompson, and of *Collectivism After Modernism: The Art of Social Imagination after 1945* with Blake Stimson, (University of Minnesota, 2007). He frequently collaborates with the artist Janet Koenig and is currently working on a book about the political economy of the art world and his concept of creative dark matter for Pluto Press. He is Assistant Professor of Sculpture in the Department of Art and Art History at Queens College.
