Herrick Memorial Library and Samuel R. Scholes Library each have great study spaces for students!

Some spaces can be reserved ahead of time and others are first-come-first-serve.

Reservable spaces:

Garden Room (Herrick) can be reserved for studying with priority given to participating in online classes, Telemedicine appointments, etc

Large Group Study Room (Scholes) several big tables and a whiteboard, priority given to groups

Tutoring Room (Scholes) can be reserved by individuals or small groups

Children's Room (Herrick) can be reserved for group study

Seminar Room (Herrick) priority given to groups or for uses requiring the videoconferencing technology

Walk-in spaces:

Saxon Station (Herrick) open area with restaurant-style booths for individual or group work (Lower Level)

3 study rooms (Herrick) available on a walk-in basis for individuals or small groups

11 study rooms (Scholes) spread across three floors, comfortably seat 1-4 people

Numerous open areas at both Herrick and Scholes with soft seating, tables, desks, rolling whiteboards and more!

24 Hours Study Rooms:

Both Herrick and Scholes have 24 Hour access study spaces. These rooms have separate entrances from the main library entrance and are accessed via keypad entry. To obtain the keycode please show your AU ID at the front desk. Herrick and Scholes have separate access codes, so if you wish to use both spaces please obtain the code from each library.

September 10th - October 11th 2021

A multimedia dance installation that seamlessly integrates contemporary dance and film. Inspired in part by the Japanese onomatopoeia tokimeki which describes the sound a fluttering heart makes as it discovers love, the work offers onlookers an escape from

the overbearance of their individual realities by inviting them into an alternate, colorless world. Through choreographer Cameron McKinney's idiosyncratic mix of contemporary floorwork and street dance-influenced movements and vibrant visuals by filmmaker Cayla Simpson, the protagonist's unexpected journey of self-discovery becomes a catalyst for vivid distortions that leave his world forever changed.
