Ikebana Ziggurat

Ikebana and Ziggurat are both distinct formalist structures. The work of Ellen Bahr and Kathleen McShane can be located within a conceptual Ikebana where space is the prominent compositional element. Using an often pared-down aesthetic, McShane and Bahr share a line of inquiry that focuses on the construction of space, as opposed to a representation of space.

Bahr's temporary, abstract arrangements are influenced by the small studio space where she works and the properties of the materials she manipulates. McShane's drawings are informed by an extended approach to what drawing can be, and often in response to the expansive sense of space she experiences in Texas. The exhibition is a kind of laboratory. In addition to photographs and drawings, each artist will build a "ziggurat" of works by artists who have been mentors and important influences, including Alfred alumni, as well as current and former faculty: Patrick Brennan, Jonathan Faber, Charles Goldman, John Hosford, Whitney Hubbs, Paul Kotula, Mary Lum, Lydia McCarthy, Stephanie McMahon, Ted Morgan, Sally Ross, Jennifer Niederhauser-Schlup, and Linda Sormin.

Lauren Koch is visiting Alfred as our MeltDown artist and will be speaking about her work at the foundry. She will also be conducting a rust printing workshop on Thursday afternoon Nov 1st from 2 - 4pm

Currently at the University of Maryland Lauren's roots run deep in the Appalachian foothills of red Georgia clay that was plowed and planted by her ancestors.

'Combining elements of nature, architecture, agriculture, industry, and domestication provide a basis for my language and allow me to defy and challenge traditional gender roles. I beautify the grit and grime of industry and agriculture with the application of delicate textile patterns and the industrialization of domesticated tasks using memories and history as my guide.

By joining opposing, gendered forces such as delicate lace and rough steel, I am identifying these qualities as part of a false binary. Focusing on the antiquated forms of these gendered elements,

instead of modern, more ambiguous gender trends, makes this binary more pronounced and easier to identify within the context of my body of work.'

Lectures will be given by Daoist Masters from China. Below are their bios.
Grandmaster Anren Yu, the 12th Lineage Holder of the Tai Yi Swimming Dragon Sect, learned the family traditions of boxing, weaponry and other self-cultivation methods from his grandfather. Grandmaster Yu was the last person to receive the family art. Grandmaster Yu broke the family tradition in 1984 he donated the style to the state and started to teach it openly. He compiled and structured the Taiyi Swimming Dragon Chuan, Taiyi Riding the Wind Sword and the other conventions of boxing and weaponry from the Taiyi Men family into a structured syllabus.
Guozhen Tian, Grandmaster Yu's wife, is the main force in tirelessly promoting the family lineage through organizing teaching activities, filming and editing Swimming Dragon Sect videos and books. She is also the main teacher for the Tai Yi Walking Style.
Master Shihai Yu, Grandmaster Yu's son, is the official successor of the Tai Yi Swimming Dragon Sect as the 13th Lineage Holder. Shawn was a successful financial advisor before changing his career to a full time Tai Yi instructor.
Dr. Liping Zhu has been teaching Qigong and Swimming Dragon Tai Chi in the US for more than 20

years. She also practices acupuncture and Traditional Chinese Medicine for the past 14 years in San Francisco. She is one of the earliest disciples of Grandmaster Yu and was instrumental in bringing the Swimming Dragon Tai Chi lineage to the West. Guifang Liu, or Master Fang, is the coach of Tai Chi at the Confucius Institute of Alfred University since 2011. She is the director of Overseas Exchange Center at Martial Arts Association of Hunan Province, China and the vice president of Chinese Swimming Dragon Association. Over these years, she has won many awards including the champion of the 12th Hong Kong Martial Arts International Championship in 2014, the Sanya World Tai Chi Culture Festival in 2016. She is also a national judge of martial arts in China. In 2017, she was awarded the Spirit of Service Award of Alfred NY.
