VIRTUAL - Environmental Studies Speaker Series - Sallie Greenberg '94

Due to Hurricane Ian impacting travel, our speaker this week, Sallie Greenberg '94, will be giving her talk virtually. Please use the zoom

The Environmental Studies and Geology Division at Alfred University will once again be presenting weekly talks on environmental topics this fall. The Environmental Studies program at AU has been sponsoring talks by visiting speakers for over 20 years, and they are typically attended by students, faculty, and members of the community.

Join us on Friday, Sept. 30th to hear Sallie Greenberg (AU '94) give a talk titled ""The Cycle of Matter: Your Roadmap for a Career in ENS".

Sallie E. Greenberg, Ph.D. is a Principal Research Scientist of Energy & Minerals at the Illinois State Geological Survey - University of Illinois. Dr. Greenberg acts as a Strategic Advisor for government and industry on the Energy Transition. Over the last 20+ years, she led the Illinois Basin - Decatur Project, a one million tons carbon storage project, to completion and has consulted or contributed to more than 30 energy and carbon capture and storage projects, especially in the areas of project development, risk reduction, and stakeholder engagement. Dr. Greenberg specializes and consults in many areas including strategic development, government relations, energy policy, environmental and social justice, project review, and relationship building.

Dr. Greenberg uses her advanced degrees in low temperature geochemistry and education to create strategies for change based on understanding public challenges related to balancing societal demands for energy with environmental concerns. Dr. Greenberg holds a Ph.D. in Secondary and Continuing Education and Master of Science degree in Geology from the University of Illinois, and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Geology from Alfred University.

Festival of Chinese Music at the Alfred Farmers Market

Alfred Farmers' Market presents a Festival of Chinese Music and Culture, Sunday October 2

The Alfred Farmers' Market was recently awarded a grant, Expanding Access to the Arts in Western NY. This grant, funded by the New York State Council on the Arts and administered by the Cullen Foundation was available to nonprofit organizations in the six counties of Western NY. (Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Erie, Niagara and Wyoming.) Our market's proposal "Music at the Market" was one of 65 organizations receiving grants and will fund three special music events at the Market during the 2022-23 season.

Our first Expanding the Arts event will be a Chinese Festival on Sunday,

October 2 during our usual market hours, 11:00AM -3:00PM. The event will feature local and guest artists, a Tai Chi demonstration and Chinese recipes that use ingredients available at our market.

To expand access to the arts in our county, there will also be a special Guzheng workshop on Saturday, October 1 at 3:00PM where you can learn the basics of playing the Chinese Guzheng, a beautiful harp-like instrument. This class is free and open to anyone, parental guidance is requested for children under the age of 9. The workshop will be held in the Miller Building on the Alfred University campus in room 302. Pre-register for the class by contacting Luanne Crosby at fclarke@alfred.edu. We have use of 10 instruments and will hold a second class if there is enough interest.

There will also be an information session on Saturday, October 1 at 7:00 PM in Howell Hall on the Alfred University Campus. Musicians Leah Ou and MingRen Huang will talk about traditional and popular Chinese music and will demonstrate the unique instruments.

All events are free and the community is welcome and encouraged to attend.
