Guest Recital: Soprano Jewel Buckwalter & Pianist Johanna Schilling

On Sunday, April 26, at 3 p.m. soprano Jewel Buckwalter and pianist Johanna Schilling will perform in recital in Howell Hall. Jewel and Johanna will be collaboratively performing an aria from the St. John Passion by Bach, the aria "Oh quante volte, oh quante" by Bellini, three pieces from Ariettes Oubliees by Debussy and three pieces by Richard Hundley. Johanna will also perform solo piano works by Ravel and Liszt.

Jewel Buckwalter, an Alfred native, is a vocal performance major completing her junior year at Houghton College. She has studied voice privately with Betty Giles, Dr. Jean Reigles, Dr. Louima Lilite, and Kelley Hijleh. Spring 2009 has provided many opportunities for performance: Jewel made her professional debut with the Buffalo Choral Arts Society and the Cheektowaga Symphony singing the soprano solo from Haydn's Lord Nelson Mass, her Houghton acting debut as the Witch from Sondheim's "Into the Woods" with the Houghton Opera Theatre Program, and has performed extensively with the Houghton College Choir, serving as its president this year.

Johanna Schilling is currently a junior piano performance major at the Greatbatch School of Music at Houghton College, where she studies piano with Dr. William Newbrough. She previously studied with Dr. Arthur Johnson, professor of piano at Lakeland College in her hometown of Sheboygan, WI. Schilling was awarded the Presidential Music Scholarship from the Greatbatch School of Music, as well as the Ruth DeYoung Kohler Scholarship for artistic merit from the Kohler Foundation. In 2005 she was the winner of the Wisconsin state level of the MTNA Senior Piano Competition and went on to compete in the 2006 East Central Division competition in Indiana. During this past year, Schilling was a finalist in the 2008 World Piano Pedagogy Conference's Most Wanted piano competition held in Dallas, TX. She was also selected as a winner in the 2008-09 Houghton Philharmonia Soloist Competition.

The recital is free and open to the public. There will be a donation basket towards the girls' expenses for the Houghton College Choir May 2009 European Tour.
