

## **Saxons place four on D3football.com All-East Region teams**

ALFRED, NY Four members of the Alfred University football team have been named East Region All-Stars by D3football.com, a leading website promoting Division III college football. Sophomore tailback Vinson Hendrix (Rochester, NY/East) and senior defensive tackle Don Miller (LeRoy, NY/LeRoy) were named First Team selections; senior placekicker Chris Reynolds (Pittsford, NY/Pittsford-Sutherland) was named to the Second Team; and senior quarterback Paul Keeley (Caledonia, NY/Caledonia-Mumford) was a Third Team pick. Hendrix ran 1,406 yards (a school single-season record) and 12 touchdowns and also caught 32 passes for 326 yards and a pair of scores. He ranked 13th in the nation in rushing yards, 15th in rush yards per game (127.8), and 19th in all-purpose yard per game (159.9). A First Team Empire 8 Conference all-star, his eight games with at least 100 yards on the ground tied an AU single-season record. Miller was a First Team Empire 8 all-star for a second straight year and earned all-conference recognition each of his four seasons at AU. He had 68 tackles this year, including 8.5 for loss and 2.5 sacks, and also defended two passes and blocked a kick. He also ran for six touchdowns and finished his career with 11 rushing TDs. An American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) First Team All-American as a junior in 2006, he will leave Alfred with more than 200 career tackles. Reynolds will leave AU with most major single-season and career kicking records. This year, he made seven of 10 field goal tries and 48 of 51 extra point attempts. His 48 PATs made and 69 points scored kicking are new school single-season marks. He also owns career records for field goals and extra points made and points scored kicking, and the single-season mark for field goals made. He is a three-time Empire 8 all-star and made the First Team this season. Keeley, a three-time All-Empire 8 selection and a Second Team pick this year, broke nearly every AU passing record during his three seasons at AU after transferring from St. John Fisher in 2005. His 3,015 passing yards, 34 TD passes, 166.3 passer efficiency rating and 64.4 completion percentage this year are all new AU single-season records. He ranked fifth in the nation in passing efficiency, 11th in passing yards, and 16th in passing yards per game (274.1). He also established new AU career records for passing yards, touchdown passes, passer efficiency, and completion percentage and set new single-game marks for TD passes and completion percentage.
