Until then we will not be updating nor processing any new waiver/substitution forms. Over the summer we will be working on transferring current waiver/substitutions that students have into Degree Works.

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Alfred University is implementing a new degree audit software called Degree Works to replace the degree evaluation currently used in BannerWeb. Expected completion is by October 31st when Advising Week starts for the spring term.

As we transition there will be a temporary hiatus of waiver/substitutions. We need to 1. Transfer the current waiver/substitutions into Degree Works. And 2. Since Degree Works is also expected to automate some adjustments a waiver/substitution may not be needed. So it is best to wait for any new waiver/subs. Degree Works calls waivers and substitutions "exceptions". Where the student is given an exception to the degree/major requirements. There will be an update on how to submit and process these in late summer.

We will keep you apprised of our progress.
