Student Alert System

After some maintenance to the program, the student alert link is back up and running on the our.alfred Web page.

The student alert system is intended to serve as a proactive measure to make sure that our students stay on track academically. Alerts can be submitted by faculty, staff, coaches, work-study supervisors, etc...

Typically "alert-able" circumstances include poor attendance, missing work, poor exam grades, withdrawn/depressed behavior, or anything else you notice that may result in the student underperforming academically.

Once an alert is submitted, appropriate parties are notified and there is a collaborative outreach between Student Affairs and Academic Affairs, with the form of outreach depending on the nature of the alert.

To submit an alert, go to <http://www.our.alfred.edu>. Hover over the Faculty/Staff link on the left until more options pop up. Click on "student alert" at the bottom of that pop-out list. You will be prompted to sign in using the same username/password combination you would use to access your campus e-mail.

Also, you can often save money on many generic prescriptions by NOT using your insurance plan. In many circumstances, you can purchase generic prescription medication at local pharmacies for less than you are paying in co-pays.

For example, if you take the generic version of Pravachol for a cholesterol condition or Synthroid for a thyroid condition you could purchase these medications without insurance for as little as \$3.99 per month or \$9.99 for a 90-day supply.

This example is based on purchasing the medicine at a ShopRite pharmacy. Other stores such as Wal-Mart and Walgreens also offer discounts. Check out their Web sites as well other drugstores near you.
