Let's Get Ready for Your Taxes! Save A Stamp and get your W-2 Now!

Your W-2 Tax Form for 2017 is ready for on-line delivery now! Why wait until you get it in the mail when you can have it now for a head start? If you got it electronically last year you do not have to do anything but log on to Banner Web and retrieve it in the "Employee" tab under tax forms. If you did not do it last year or are new to A-U you can get yours on line too by logging on to Banner Web, go to the "Employee" tab, click on Tax Forms and enter 2017. You will be asked to Approve receiving the form electronically and then you can print it out. Any employee who has not authorized Electronic W-2 by Friday, January 26 at 5:00 will have their form mailed to the address we have on file January 31, 2018.

Reading Your W-2 Tax Form

HR has received many questions regarding the W-2 and why the numbers do not match up with what you earn.. To help understand how the figures on a W-2 are determined I wanted to provide a short description for each box. Box 1 is your "Taxable Earnings" but not your "gross earnings" and is made up of all your pay, less any non-taxable deductions such as health insurance, dental, vision, Flex Spending, retirement, etc. Box 2 is your Federal income Tax withheld. Box 3 and 5 are Social Security and Medicare Wages which is comprised of all pay, less anything that is not subject to Social Security (Health, Dental, Vision, Flexible Spending) but not retirement which is subject to SS earnings. Boxes 4 and 5 are the amounts withheld for SS and Medicare. Box 12 is a catchall that includes any voluntary tax exempt retirement (E) and the total value of your health insurance coverage both what you pay and what A-U pays (DD). Box 13 shows whether or not you have a retirement plan and Box 14 shows your contributions to that plan. Finally, across the bottom is the state taxes and earnings reported.
