If you would like to take advantage of this event, please have your materials delivered to the Jordan Hall parking lot by no later than 11:30 AM that day. Physical Plant will also be able to assist offices that have several boxes of materials to be destroyed. Simply put in a work order by no later than July 5th, and they will make sure that it is taken down to the site. Here are some guidelines for the event: - Documents must be sensitive in nature. If they are not, then they do not require shredding and should be recycled instead. - Materials must be removed from binders and folders. - Materials may be stapled, but any binder clips, coils, etc., must be removed.
