

Alfred University alumna helps Brooklyn school attain highest-ever college acceptance rate

BROOKLYN, NY An alumna of Alfred University's School Counseling-AUNYC program was part of an effort that resulted in the senior class at a Brooklyn high school achieving its highest-ever rate of college acceptance.

James Madison High School was recently featured on a televised report on Brooklyn News 12 for having the school's highest-ever college acceptance rate. Typically, James Madison sends 60 to 65 percent of its seniors on to college; for the Class of 2018, that number exceeds 90 percent.

Helen Rosado, who earned a master's degree in school counseling in 2017 from Alfred University's AUNYC program in Brooklyn, was interviewed for the news report. Rosado is a college adviser in James Madison High School's guidance office.

Alfred University's School Counseling-AUNYC program is a partnership with the Center for Integrated Teacher Education (CITE) and offers master's degrees in school counseling. It is a satellite of the counseling program on the University's main campus in Alfred, with AUNYC programs offered in locations in Brooklyn (St. Francis College) and Oceanside, Long Island.
