Your increased information security vigilance is essential

Due to the recent invasion of Ukraine by Russia forces, organizations everywhere are amplifying cybersecurity defenses.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security encourages everyone to be on increased alert for potential cyberattacks.

What is Alfred University doing?
In response, Alfred University Information Technology Services has heightened its cybersecurity awareness. As recommended by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Alfred University has already implemented 2-factor authentication (2FA) and ITS also scans our entire network for known software and system vulnerabilities.

What can I do?
Practicing good cybersecurity is especially important right now. We encourage you to be on heightened alert for phishing emails, unexpected text messages and unusual phone calls.

Phishing
Phishing and other forms of social engineering attempts to steal personal

information by tricking you into clicking a link or giving up your password or other protected information.

While Alfred University has protective measures in place to reduce phishing emails, some of those emails do get through to your inbox. Please be vigilant and lookout for suspicious links and spoofed websites.

Change in two-factor authentication procedures for off-campus email and MS

Alfred University, higher education and more generally the United States continue to see an increase in information security risk, especially ransomware. An important mitigation to this risk is the University's adoption of two factor authentication (2FA). To help you better identify and verify that the 2FA request is one that you are expecting, ITS will be upgrading our 2FA procedures to include the requirement that Email and MS Teams logins will now require the input of a two digit number in mobile-based authenticator app when you are login into email and MS Teams (from off-campus).

We understand that this will require an additional click in the mobile app, and we appreciate your continued support of efforts to keep us safe from bad actors who would compromise our systems, steal our information and disrupt our mission of educating students. We will upgrading those procedure on May 12th 2022. If you
