### Accounting For Time Due to the Weather Emergency

In order for the Payroll Department to properly account for time, please note the following instruction for the days of March 14 and 15:

Tuesday, March 14: The University closed to all but essential personnel. For non-essential personnel, time should be recorded as "excused" depending on the employee's normal schedule (7 hours, 7.5 hours or 8 hours). In the comments section please indicate "weather closing".

Wednesday March 15: Alfred University is open for classes and regular business today, March 15. Due to the weather conditions and safety concerns, some employees may have chosen not to come to work or may have been delayed in their arrival. The University respects the judgement of the employee as to the safety of reporting to work. If an employee is delayed coming to work they may use "Personal" or "Floating Holiday" time in one-hour increments to account for the delayed attendance. The employee also has the option of a shortened lunch period (but no less than 30 minutes is required to be taken) to make up the time or, with the approval of the supervisor, can make up the time by staying a little later.

If an employee made the decision not to come in due to the weather, he/she will be required to use a vacation day, personal day, or floating holiday for the absence.

Core Sample: Additional Findings is the second in a series of exhibitions that explore the permanent collection of The Alfred Ceramic Art Museum. That collection features the art of renowned Alfred University ceramic art faculty, as well as other major 20th and 21st century American and international ceramic artists. In addition, the exhibition will include ceramic works of individuals whom the Museum calls "Ancestors" - ceramic artists of the ancient Americas, as well as Japan, China, Korea, Africa, and American Indian communities. Finally, the Museum's collection includes works from its Master of Fine Arts collection, representing the astonishing creativity and intellectual rigor of artists who have received MFA degrees in ceramic art from Alfred University.

Admission is free every Thursday from 5 to 7 p.m. Admission is free for Museum members, Alfred State and Alfred University faculty, staff and students and children under 18. Admission during regular hours is \$7 for general public; \$5 for senior citizens, and \$3 for local residents for non-Alfred students, AAA or military service.

Museum hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday; 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. Thursday; 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

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Alfred University Online Photo Library - Gallery Server Pro

AU's faculty/staff photo library, Gallery Server Pro (<http://gsp.alfred.edu>) has expanded over the past year!

Hundreds of images have been added since Gallery Server Pro (GSP) was originally launched in the fall of 2015, and new ones continue to be added almost daily.

Below is a refresher for all faculty/staff.

This searchable photo library contains a wide variety of downloadable AU images ranging from seasonal campus scenics, to classrooms/labs, selected campus events, official AU Faculty/Staff portraits, and much more.

GSP images are in folders cataloged by semester, by month and by topic, and as new photo assignments are completed, selected images are cataloged and posted on a regular basis. The photos are extensively tagged to assist in searches for specific subjects.

#### WHO CAN ACCESS GALLERY SERVER PRO?

GSP is accessible to any faculty or staff member who has been provided access by ITS. It is NOT accessible to students, or to the public.

#### TO ACCESS GALLERY SERVER PRO

1. Go to our.alfred.edu and hover over the left-hand side menu item "Faculty/Staff." The Gallery Server link is the 13th item listed in the fly-out menu.
2. Type in <http://gsp.alfred.edu> in your browser

Once GSP launches in your browser, you will need to enter your AU username (not full email) and email password.

#### IF YOU HAVE TROUBLE ACCESSING GSP

Those who haven't yet accessed GSP, must email Steven Bucklaew of ITS ([bucklaew@alfred.edu](mailto:bucklaew@alfred.edu)) who will provide access and confirm it via email soon after he receives the request. It usually happens within minutes!

#### BEFORE YOU DOWNLOAD

The primary use of many of these images is for Admissions and University Relations marketing efforts in both printed and web formats. In order to keep track of downloads (except for faculty/staff portraits), we recommend you email Rick McLay ([mclay@alfred.edu](mailto:mclay@alfred.edu)) or Judy Linza ([linza@alfred.edu](mailto:linza@alfred.edu)) with a brief description of which image(s) you are downloading, and where it is going to be used.

#### DOWNLOADING AN IMAGE

There are two recommended downloadable formats:

1. Web optimized (low resolution but full size), and
2. Original (high resolution). To download the image of your choice, use the download/share icon, which is the one on the left in the icon grouping above each image, and follow the directions.
