Environmental Studies Speaker- Brennan Ferguson '15

This week's Alfred University's Environmental Studies Program will be presenting a talk (online via Zoom) entitled "Radioactive: Studying Uranium Transport Across Scales". The speaker will be Brennan Ferguson, a graduate student at Clemson University. Ms. Ferguson grew up outside the swamps of New Orleans and received a B.A. in Chemistry and Environmental Studies from Alfred University in 2015. While at AU, she was the recipient of several academic awards and a star player on the AU tennis team. Currently, she is pursuing a PhD in Environmental Engineering at Clemson University in South Carolina studying the transport of uranium in the subsurface.
