

Perry's work has place in upcoming Brooklyn art space screening/lecture

A piece by Sondra Perry, AU Class of 2012, will be part of a screening/lecture Tuesday, April 28 at Light Industry, a venue for film and electronic art in Brooklyn.

Sondra's one-minute clip "My Twilight Zone" will be included along with the work of seven other artists in "Quality Television" a screening and lecture by Martine Syms, an artist/conceptual entrepreneur based in Los Angeles.

The program begins at 7:30 p.m. Tickets will be available at the door for \$7; the box office opens at 7. Seating is limited and will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Light Industry is at 155 Freeman St., Brooklyn.

Sondra, who recently was an Institute for Electronic Arts residency artist on campus, was included in a 2013 Huffington Post article "Black Artists: 30 Contemporary Art Makers Under 40 You Should Know." In that article she said she creates work that "is dimensional... "It expands and contracts with meaning. Though I like my viewers to sift through the work with their own cognitive energy, I hope at least one of those dimensions is accessible for the folks who experience the live performance or the aftermath. I'm interested in the visceral: taste, smell, sound, texture. If anything I'd like the audience have an awareness of their body in relation to the materials I use and their physical and historical nature."
