### Artist in Residence Presentation: Bernd Klug and Johanna Tiedtke

Date: April 14, 2016, 6 p.m.

Bernd Klug and Johanna Tiedtke of Brooklyn will be participating in a two-week artist residency at the Institute for Electronic Arts beginning April 14.

Working under the collective name BEARING, Tiedtke, a German painter, and Klug, an Austrian sound artist, began their collaboration working on the album "Cold Commodities" and would see their work grow organically by building a tight knit net of relations between sound and imprint, making use of acoustics, human interactions, geographic locations, personal viewpoints, and time as interchanging factors.

BEARING has held exhibitions at the Galerie Freihausgasse Villach, Austria, and at the Austrian Cultural Forum in New York City.

Tiedtke and Klug's ambitious proposal will see the team continuing work on their project installed originally at the Galerie Freihausgasse Villach involving zinc plates which visitors to the show left visual and acoustic traces through touching them. These zinc plates were scanned and translated into 12" vinyl records and, for a release, Tiedtke and Klug intend to produce prints from these records as well as design and print album covers for an eventual release of these records.

### How Does Google Decide Who Makes the Cut as a Googler?

If these topics sound interesting, these undergraduate and graduate summer course offerings are for you! Courses are open to most students but may be subject to instructor permission.

MGMT 300 01/MBA 600 03: People Analytics - This course focuses on the tools, procedures, and analyses used to inform data-based human capital decisions in organizations.

The methods taught in this course will be applied to HR and OB policy in organizations including but not limited to staffing, training, and measuring employee performance and satisfaction. Identification of the appropriate tools and statistical procedures for analyzing human capital will be emphasized along with the ability to effectively interpret and communicate statistical analyses into organizational policy recommendations.

MBA 600 02: Modern Issues in HRM - This course emphasizes five contemporary HRM trends in the workplace. The Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM) lists several of these trends as critical for HR professionals' success in the coming years. These trends include management of knowledge workers, contemporary hiring strategies, workforce training and gamification, work/life balance, and demographic issues in talent management. An evaluation of the utility of HR departments in the modern workforce is also examined.
